Where is Your Trust?

We have many ways to describe the various facets of a condition we've all struggled with: some refer to it as people pleasing, others insecurity. Some call it by the diagnoses co-dependency, while others merely call it shyness or self-consciousness. But whatever the name, the root is the same: the fear of man.

This weekend, I crossed the finish line of my first 5K. The crowds lined the

streets offering shouts of encouragement and praise: "You can do this!" "Way, to go!" Unaware that for years my desire to run was unfulfilled because I feared them.

I was the woman who, while taking walks in my neighborhood, would feel the desire to run well up within me. Then I'd look to see if anyone could see me before I began my few seconds of running. I was enslaved.



TEACHING TIP. John wrote in his third epistle, "I have no greater joy than to hear that my children are walking in the truth." Are you emotionally invested in seeing your students walking in the truth?



TEACHING TIP. "All flesh is like grass and all its glory like the flower of grass. The grass withers, and the flower falls, but the word of the Lord remains forever." (1 Peter 1:24-25) May the flowers of spring remind us of the matchless glory of God.



TEACHING TIP. Help your young students recognize the importance of honoring their mother; not only on Mother's Day, but by how they heed her instructions every day. (Proverbs 1:8)

We are so easily tempted to fear man, to seek our security, or place our hope in others rather than the Lord. Over and over again Scripture addresses this problem.

Speaking of the coming day of the Lord, Isaiah warns, "Stop regarding man in whose nostrils is breath, for of what account is he?" (Isaiah 2:22)

"It is better to take refuge in the LORD than to trust in man. It is better to take refuge in the LORD than to trust in princes," declares Psalm 118:8-9.

God says to people of Judah, "Cursed is the man who trusts in man and makes flesh his strength, whose heart turns away from the Lord." (Jeremiah 17:5)

The fear of man lays a snare in our lives. We become enslaved when we seek to find our safety, security, and salvation in one another. Yet we are safe when our hope rests fully in the Lord our God.

The fear of man lays a snare, but whoever trusts in the LORD is safe. (Proverbs 29:25)

Imprisoned at Ravensbrück concentration camp for illegally sheltering Jews during World War II, Corrie ten Boom reflected, "If you look at the world, you'll be distressed. If you look within, you'll be depressed. If you look at God you'll be at rest."

In the midst of unspeakable wickedness and conditions we might not immediately recognize as safe, Corrie
